

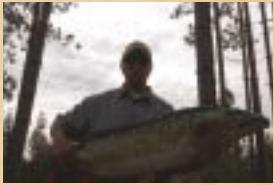


The Dos & Don'ts Of Trophy Fish Photography.

A quick guide of what to do and not do for beautiful shots of your fish of a lifetime while you're at Nueltin Lodges.

* Note: no stuffed fish were injured or sacrificed during this demonstration.

* The Don'ts *



Don't shoot into the sun. Ask your guide to spin the boat around so that the sun is at the photographer's back. Always use your "fill-in" flash, to add sparkle and take out any heavy shadows.



Don't hold the fish next to your body. Even a 45 incher can lose up to 10 inches if not held out. Also, don't let the tail wrap around you, show the length of that trophy!



Don't cut off any of the fish. Fill the whole frame but don't cut anything off. Again show the entire length of your fish.



Don't ever hold a big fish vertically. Not only is it hard on the point you're holding, but hard on the fish's organs "running south". Even if released, the fish could die later if internal organ don't fall back into their proper space.



Don't ever hold a big fish vertically even with a Boga Grip™ - style grip scale. Weigh the fish in one of our rubber nets subtract the net weight and you have your fish weight without hurting the fish.



Don't cover up your face with the fish or with your hat being pulled down too far.



Don't show too much of the top of the fish. Profile is the best!



Don't show too much of the bottom of the fish. Again, profile is the best!

* The Dos *

- Use your fill-in flash
- Use "FINE" (2400 x 1800) or "NORMAL" (1280 x 960) settings on your digital camera (see your own owner's manual)
- Holding the fish horizontal toward the camera, shooting the whole fish, without covering your face
- Also wear bright-colored clothes
- Tip up your hat to show your face
- Please put down any cigars or cigarettes (for nicer shots).

• Forced Flash

• FINE • NORMAL •



★ The key is to get set up, settle down and get ready to shoot while leaving the fish in the net and in the water. That way, you will get the shot of a lifetime and the fish will continue to produce more generations of trophy fish! ★

The Top 3 Things To Remember:

1. Have the sun to the photographer's back. Never shoot into the sun!
2. Hold your fish out from your body!
3. Never hold a big fish vertically. Horizontal only.
